From the Pastor,

One Holy Family

“Pray to God that I truly be the brother (and sister) of all.” Blessed Charles de Foucauld God so loved the world. What greater love than to be one with us down to the tight fist of a newborn child. You too entered history helpless and dependent on the care of others. We are first loved through bloody tissue, feedings, soothing words, the warmth of bodies bringing comfort and delight. How did love so embodied produce beings who are tempted by fantastic notions like the self-made man?

In Hebrews, Paul calls faith “the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen”. Abram hears words in a vision. He pleads for a child and God listens. Simeon and Anna beg God for a glimpse or sign. God responds to the yearning of these righteous elders. In the temple they encounter the child and realize that God’s promise is kept.

To modern ears, faith suggests a plunge into darkness. A loss of friction with what is real. We know that words are cheap. Threats and ridicule stream in from all sides. What words do we heed? Whom do we trust? We know that what is holy is not for sale. Faith moves quietly. First we hear “fear not.” Like Abram we learn to listen. In the concrete realities of daily life God’s spirit is felt. We are not alone. To trust God is no leap into the abyss. In ordinary ways You are already present. When we call, You answer.

In family we learn our worth. Some must search for the family that knows how to love. In being loved we heal, face our demons, and are set free. We uncover the beauty that dwells within imperfection. How we are not measured by our achievements. How each catches the light in her own irreplaceable way. How God finds us in our struggles to be faithful and forgiving.

CHRISTMAS SEASON CAN BE SAD

For years, I'm sure that many of you have heard the old refrain from some that 'Christmas is the loneliest time of the year', or 'I get so depressed at Christmas'. When we're young, we think this is 'old peoples' talk', for Christmas is exciting and fun. As we age, life happens and a beautiful time such as Christmas may take 2nd place due to a death, divorce, loss of a job, or extreme poverty. There are many reasons one could be sad at Christmas. Just watching others have a wonderful time can bring it on. I've thought a lot about it and having lived a long time, I've come to believe that something bad in their past isn't the main reason for such desolation. I've also noticed that people with faith seem to get through the holidays better than those who do not have it. Could it be that when someone is 'down' or 'sad' at Christmas, it may not be due to loneliness for a mother or grandfather who have passed. Sure, they focus on that loss but there is something larger that converges on their thinking. They may not realize it, but their loneliness centers on their lack of faith---they don't have God. We were made to be with God and to have a close relationship with Him. When that is missing, it triggers other factors that bring on the sadness.

The good news is that mankind need not be lonely because GOD CAME TO US in the person of JESUS CHRIST, whose birth we celebrate at this time. We're familiar with the name given to God, "Immanuel", which means 'God with us'. When we form a personal relationship with Jesus, fulfillment increases and loneliness decreases as we get our lives focused on God. The word, 'Behold' is used often in the Bible. In Hebrew, it means 'to fix your gaze'. Try to fix your full attention on God. If your life is going in the wrong direction, it could be because your life is not sufficiently fixed upon Jesus Christ. Keep in mind that the God who made the earth and all that is in it actually came here to be WITH US! You need not be lonely at this time of the year or any time of the year. God is with us. He walked among us and is still living in our heart today. If you are a firm believer in God, 'you'll never walk alone.' Now where have I heard that phrase before? If your life is centered on Jesus, then every step you take, you'll have Him with you. You will never be alone---Christmas or anytime.

Fr. John Reinkemeyer, my mentor, described Jesus thus to his parishioners: "'AND THE WORD WAS MADE FLESH AND DWELT AMONG US'. We have seen Him often during our lives, not in pictures, not in statues, not in buildings, BUT IN YOU! And we thank you for showing Him to us in your beautiful, holy, lives of prayer, sacrifice, generosity, and concern for one another. Jesus put on humanity that we might put on divinity!" How could we ever be lonely?
