CHILDREN OF ALL AGES

He placed a child in their midst . . . And as he did, he embraced that child. Then he spoke these two important words to his disciples. *Become* like children. *Welcome* the children.

Why a child? A child is one who lacks things. Like what? Experience . . . Command of language . . . Knowledge . . . Power . . . Independence . . . Legal rights. As such, every child is at a distinct disadvantage in society. Easily victimized. In order to survive and grow, a child needs to trust in the care and tenderness of others. We adults may think we have little in common with a child. But we do. A sudden illness, a fire or flood, the loss of a steady income, the natural aging process—each can reduce us to the plight of a child. We too need trust to survive—trust in others and in the One who sent Jesus.

Welcome the children. Some in our midst do this in exceptional ways: parents, grandparents, teachers, coaches, pediatricians, caregivers. But who else in our midst, besides children, are easily preyed upon because they lack experience, command of language, power, independence, legal rights? What about the elderly, the ill, immigrants, the homeless, the lonely, the voiceless, the economically poor, or those victimized because of race, age, gender?

Jesus is placing individuals in our midst today, asking us to emulate and earn their trust, asking us to welcome them with our love.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS
Selfless Surrender
Wis 2:12, 17-20 / Jas 3:16-4:3 / Mk 9:30-37

"If anyone wishes to be first, he must be the last of all and the servant of all." What does this mean in terms of our discipleship? It means that our call to discipleship must not become a source of pridefulness. Jesus set the bar high in terms of selfless surrender — it doesn't just mean that you give yourself over to the beautiful parts of God's will. That path will likely include some undesirable moments as well...for Jesus, that meant persecution, rejection, and crucifixion. In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples that He will be put to death, and the next thing He knows, they are arguing over who is the greatest among them. Isn't that just like humans?! Authentic discipleship is not described by greatness, privilege, or self-glorification. Instead, it is characterized by humility, meekness, lowliness, and servanthood. John the Baptist tells us that if God is to grow in us, we must diminish (Jn 3:30). This is echoed in Jesus' message today. Allow your discipleship to be great — to glorify God and build up His Kingdom, but do so quietly and by serving those who are most often overlooked.
