ALL HIS PATHS MAKE FOR PEACE

[L]et us hear what the Voice of the Word calls to us, so that one day we may progress from the Voice to the Word. "Prepare the way of the Lord," he says, "make straight his paths" [cf. Isa 40:3]. They prepare the way who amend their lives; the narrow way. An amended life is certainly the straight road by which the Lord, who in this very conversion is already there before us, may come to us. . . . For unless he who is the Life, the Truth and the Way anticipates his own advent to us, our way cannot be corrected according to the model of truth, and so cannot be directed to the way of eternity.

By what does one correct her or his way, if not by observing the Lord's words, if not by following in the footsteps of him who made himself the Way by which we might come to him?

O that my ways may be directed to keeping your ways, O Lord, so that because of the words from your lips I may follow even difficult ways. And if they should seem hard to the flesh that is weak they will seem sweet and pleasant to the spirit if it is resolute. "His ways are pleasant ways and all his paths make for peace," says the inspired writer [Prov 3:17]. The ways of Wisdom are not only at peace, they bring peace.

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

Prepare Room in Your Heart

Bar 5:1-9 / Phil 1:4-6, 8-11 / Lk 3:1-16

Today's Gospel introduces us to the mission of John the Baptist who proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins in preparation for the way of the Lord. We also see, however, that there were earthly rulers who stood in stark contrast to the establishment of the Kingdom of God which John heralded. From Caesar in Rome, to his governor of Judea, Pontius Pilate, to the tetrarch Herod who would deprive John of his earthly life, we are reminded that although we should "give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar" we should ultimately strive to seek Him who offers us eternal governance and salvation. As we enter further into this Advent season, let us remember to prepare room in our hearts for Him who is the Giver of all good gifts.

PRAYING THE ANGELS' PRAYER

Other than during Advent and Lent, we sing the Gloria every week. But how often do we pause to think of the origins of the opening lines of that prayer? They come, of course, from the message of the angels to the shepherds who were in the fields on the night Jesus was born: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

The Greek word used in Luke's Gospel is eudokia, which means those in whom God is pleased or is satisfied with—or even better—delights in. And God delights in all of us! So we can take comfort in God's message for us all.

But notice that the message of "glad tidings" was first announced to shepherds. At the time of Jesus, shepherds were considered to be low on the social ladder. They were sometimes even characterized as sinners. They were on the outskirts of the city, literally and figuratively. In the fields. Apart.

Yet it is to these people that Jesus' birth is first revealed. It is in keeping with the pattern of the Incarnation. Christ enters the world as a poor child, completely vulnerable and utterly dependent on his poor parents. He will live in small, insignificant town and engage in another occupation with little social standing: a carpenter.

So what poor, seemingly forgotten, and perhaps rejected part of you needs to hear that God delights in you? Can you hear the voice of the angels singing this good news?
