Seek Him

Is 60:1-6 / Eph 3:2-3a, 5-6 / Mt 2:1-12

A CHERISHED TRADITION

Few days in the liturgical calendar have a history as interesting as January 1st! As early as the seventh century, the Catholic Church in Rome celebrated a feast in honor of Mary on this day. As other Marian feasts like the Annunciation and the Assumption entered the calendar, January 1st began to be known as simply as the Octave (8th day) of Christmas.

By the year 1300, January 1st was being celebrated as both the Feast of the Circumcision and the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus. Even after the Reformation, the Catholic, Lutheran, and Anglican churches continued to celebrate the Feast of the Circumcision on January 1st for many centuries. It was only in 1969 that the Catholic Church officially designated January 1st as the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, which was presented as a restoration of an ancient practice.

The Scripture scholar Fr. Raymond Brown once suggested that the loss of the Feast of the Circumcision may have been a missed opportunity for the Church to build bridges with the Jewish community. In addition to the Gospel speaking of Jesus' circumcision, St. Paul's Letter to the Galatians speaks of Jesus being "born under the law," the Jewish Torah. Mary the Mother of God was also the mother of a Jewish child.

We cannot understand and love Jesus if we do not understand the religious tradition that shaped him so decisively. Perhaps a good New Year's resolution for all Christians would be to commit to growing in our understanding of that tradition and our brothers and sisters who continue to cherish it.
