## XENOPHILIA

Most dictionaries do not include the word “xenophilia” (love of strangers) in their listing because, unfortunately, there are few occasions in which the word is used. They do admit “xenophobia” (fear of strangers) because this is something that many of us learn from an early age. Those who are different are strange, foreign, alien, and presumably hostile—and, therefore, best avoided.

How different is the attitude shown by Abraham, who begs the strangers to allow him to take care of them. And he goes to considerable trouble to make good his offer. However, the story does not end there. The strangers leave behind an incomparable gift for Abraham and Sarah: the promise of a son.

Real hospitality involves reciprocity: both parties give and both receive. Of the household in Bethany, one part gives (Martha), and one part receives (Mary). While Martha busies herself taking care of Jesus, he in turn takes care of Mary, feeding her with the warming words that flow from his mouth.

Pope Francis is tireless in exhorting us to go out from our safe havens into the margins, to look for the stranger, the immigrant, and the poor and to take care of them. But the story does not end there. When we practice self-forgetful hospitality, we quickly discover that we also are its beneficiaries. Our care and loving concern are mysteriously and abundantly repaid by the One who was hungry and was fed by us.

If, at our funeral, we are lauded for our xenophilia, then our friends can be comfortably assured that in our lives we have passed the ultimate test, and now enjoy the hospitality of heaven.

Fr. Michael Casey, a Cistercian monk of Tarrawarra Abbey in Australia, is a retreat master, lecturer, and the author of many books, including *The Promise of Deliverance: Reading Second Isaiah*, *Coenobium: Reflections on Monastic Community*, and *The Road to Eternal Life*.
