## REJOICE ALWAYS?

The Third Sunday of Advent is called *Gaudete* Sunday, from the first word (in Latin) of the Entrance Antiphon: "*Rejoice* in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice . . ." (Phil 4:4). On this day we light the rose-colored candle in the Advent wreath, and the priest wears rose-colored vestments. There's something special about it all.

Yet the theme can seem disconnected from real life. The lingering effects of the pandemic, the violence that too frequently rocks our cities and world, the economic stress felt by many, and other forms of suffering and hardship—all these things can make it a challenge to be joyful, much less to hear the call to rejoice *always*. Really?

Paul's exhortation to rejoice is grounded in his conviction that joy is one of the manifestations of the "fruit" of the Holy Spirit (Gal 5:22). It is a good spiritual practice to remind ourselves that "the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (Rom 5:5). As we prepare to celebrate the mystery of the birth of Jesus who is Emmanuel, "God-with-us" (Matt 1:23), we can also contemplate the awesome mystery that God is within us through the Spirit, the indwelling gift of divine love—a true cause for rejoicing.

Advent is a time for waiting and longing for the Lord Jesus to return in glory, bringing to completion God's reign that his earthly life and ministry inaugurated. This is the kingdom in which "the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised . . ." (Matt 11:5). Our confidence in this hope of Jesus' coming in glory is bolstered by our attentiveness to the ways he comes to us this day and every day: in the Word, in the Eucharist, and in one another. In addition, God's fidelity to the promises fulfilled in Jesus' incarnation strengthens in us the joyful hope that God will also be faithful to the promises of "a new heaven and a new earth" (Rev 21:1).

Such a hopeful joy, however, can be difficult for many. Let's recall that Jesus, who entered the messiness of our world, is able to sympathize with our sufferings and weaknesses, because he himself experienced them. We can turn to him in confident hope (Heb 4:15-16). Moreover, we are members of the body of Christ, and "[i]f one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy" (1 Cor 12:26). In other words, we are not left to ourselves and our own devices; we belong to a community of faith that, at its best, encourages and supports—especially in times of difficulty and hardship.

*Gaudete* Sunday is an annual reminder that we, as Christians, have many grounds for joy, not least the presence of God's Spirit within us. This gift can create in us a joy that is more than an ephemeral feeling. It can create a joy that grows into a *disposition*, a way of being, when we allow it to take root at the core of our being. In the end, this gift is a call to bear witness to our joyful hope for a world in desperate need—and to do so always.
