One Minute Lent

Lv 19:1-2, 17-18 / Ps 103:1-2, 3-4, 8, 10, 12-13 / 1 Cor 3:16-23 / Mt 5:38-48

Ready or not, here I come! I have a habit of sneaking up on you shortly after Christmas. Some of you might think you are ready and have everything planned out. Maybe, maybe not! Some of you won't know I've arrived until you see your coworkers walking around with black smudges on their foreheads. If you haven't guessed it, I'm Lent. I'm not the Grinch. I'm here to help! Do you remember what your diocesan theme is this year for Stewardship? Perhaps that is a good place to start. "I have been rescued, how will I respond?" Perhaps Lent can be a time to consider how you see yourself responding to being rescued through the lens of Stewardship. Here's a Lenten challenge: every day of Lent, take one minute to close your eyes and ask the question, "I have been rescued, how will I respond?"


UPCOMING PSR MASSES

A SECOND LOOK AT POPE BENEDICT XVI

2023 began with a news story that reported the death of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI on Dec. 31, 2022, at his home in the Vatican at the age of 95. He seemed to make news often after resigning voluntarily in 2013, the first Pope to leave office in this way since Pope Celestine V did so in 1294. Benedict was close to 86 at the time, the 4th oldest person in history to occupy the office of Pope. There was no question that he was very alert and a thinker. How did the son of a policeman become the Thomas Aguinas of his time? He had his reasons.

Born Joseph Ratzinger in 1927 in Marktl, Germany, a nation struggling with inflation and poor government, he told his family he wanted a vocation within the Roman Catholic Church. WW II was raging on when he was a teenager. The Nazis drafted him and most young men into a training organization called 'Hitler Youth'. He said he had no interest in the Nazi Party and refused to attend their meetings. In his early 20s, he was drafted into the German Army. Soon, he deserted and later was caught and held as a prisoner for months as the war winded down. After WWII ended, he entered a seminary and was ordained a priest in 1951. He continued his studies and became a university professor at Bonn U in 1959. He continued his teaching until 1977 when he was appointed the Archbishop of Munich. He and Pope John Paul II had been friends for 20 years and in 1978, he was elevated to a Cardinal. Pope John Paul II died in 2005 and Cardinal Ratzinger was chosen by the conclave to be his successor. He really didn't want the job for he'd worked closely with John Paul for years and saw the immense responsibilities of a Pope. After all, he was 78 at the time and looking toward retirement! He prayed to God, "Please don't do this to me!". We figure God wasn't listening to the Cardinal that day! He took the name, Benedict, to honor Pope Benedict XV who served as Pope during World War I. He made the decision to retire himself. Some still ask why he retired so abruptly. I'll explore that in the future. I just felt that Benedict XVI had too many positive attributes to be cast aside in 2005 and forgotten. Well, he wasn't forgotten & we'll look at that down the road. --Marcel Normand
