## **THE PLENARY INDULGENCE: AN EXPLANATION**

This past week, my niece, Donna Maus, a teacher at St. Mary's-Colgan High School, shared some literature she found from Catholic author, Maura McKeegam. Featured in the material was an excellent Lenten suggestion on "Gaining a Plenary Indulgence before Easter". McKeegam has written several Catholic books, one which she co-authored with Scott Hahn. My first thought was, "Whatever happened to indulgences?" They're still around but many folks don't seem to understand them.

To use an illustration---let's say that someone betrays your trust--I'll call him Kent. So afterward, Kent regrets his behavior and tells you he's sorry. You forgive him, but that doesn't mean your relationship isn't damaged to some extent. Well, the same thing happens when we sin. We regret our behavior and confess our sin to Father. Christ forgives us, but that doesn't mean our relationship, and our soul, aren't damaged. Repairing this injury requires a combination of 'time' and 'pain' called Temporal Punishment. Indulgences free us from some or all of the temporal punishment in the same way that medicine helps a cut to heal quicker and less painfully. Indulgences involve prayer and penance when we perform works of mercy and love in imitation of Christ and his saints. After we die, we work through any remaining temporal punishment in purgatory.

Indulgences acquired a bad reputation during the Middle Ages (500-1500) because certain corrupt Church officials would grant them in exchange for money. No doubt, this one issue led to the Protestant Reformation more than any other disagreement. The Catholic Church still teaches about indulgences and how these 'works of mercy' can partially or completely free us from temporal punishment. But, just like the term, Purgatory, this topic of 'indulgences' continues to be a source of disagreement between Catholics and other faiths. Many who disagree with them have called indulgences 'shortcuts to heaven'. They assuredly are not, for to gain an indulgence as a faithful Christian, you must be duly disposed and only when other conditions are met. I'd emphasize that if you suspect that you have some temporal punishment to account for, DO NOT PUT OFF, but see a priest about indulgences, for any punishment not received on earth will be suffered in Purgatory, the Church teaches us. Many liberal Christians envision 'sin' differently than Catholics. They like to quote the Bible, saying 'God is love', but recall, that same Bible also says 'God is just'. More on indulgences next time and consequences of unpreparedness. We'll explain ways to gain a plenary indulgence before Easter. --Marcel Normand
