#### THE PLENARY INDULGENCE: PART II

Most Christians hope to reach Heaven at their death. We've discussed methods to help us along life's way to offset sins that we've committed. Catholics have the sacrament of Reconciliation or confession, as we often say, that is available to us as often as we want to use it - - whether it be once a month or per week if needed. We know that delaying confession causes sins to accumulate and there are consequences for such procrastination. And if our lives were taken prematurely, much temporal punishment has also accumulated. We know that every sin must be paid for, and even if we're fortunate enough to reach purgatory, we will suffer the results of our negligence until the last cent is paid. Last week, I mentioned that temporal punishment can be reduced significantly while we're alive through such actions as Holy Mass, the rosary, the Stations, Adoration, and indulgences among others.


If you know your sins have piled up and you've postponed confession, a good plan would be to go to confession and attempt to reduce any future punishment after death. Indulgences are offered by God's mercy and the Church to give us direction on gaining them either for ourselves or for the souls in purgatory. It is harder for a young person, who lives in the moment, to fully realize the importance of preparing for eternity - - it seems so far away. Yet, we know that each day could be our last, whether you're 18 or 81.

There is still time before Easter to gain a plenary indulgence. Here are a few ways to accomplish it: 1) Say the "Prayer Before a Crucifix" on Good Friday after Communion. This prayer is listed on the back cover of our Daily Mass Propers titled "BREAKING BREAD". 2) another way is granted to the faithful who attend liturgical services for the Adoration of the Cross on Good Friday and who devoutly adore and kiss the Cross. 3) the plenary indulgence is granted those who piously make the Way of the Cross (Stations). A Catholic should be in a state of grace and must have the intention to obtain it and must fulfill the following conditions: a) go to Confession within 20 days before or after; b) recite one Our Father and one Hail Mary for the Holy Father; c) receive Holy Communion; and d) be free from attachment to all sin, including venial. This last one is the hard one to prepare for, as some wonder whether it's possible to be completely detached from venial sin! The answer is found in Mark: 10 when Jesus tells his disciples how hard it is to enter the Kingdom of God. They ask: How can we be saved? Jesus answered: "For human beings, it is impossible, but not for God." He tells them 'All things are possible for God.' So we should ask Him for the grace to achieve the indulgence. Matthew 7 says: "Ask and it will be given you."

It appears to me that the two essentials for this to happen is Confession and Communion. Remember, Good Friday is next week. See if you can gain a plenary indulgence. It would, no doubt, cancel some of our temporal punishment.
