

HEARING THE GREATEST NEWS!

Christians throughout the world are hearing the greatest news once again! CHRIST HAS RISEN! We often call it the Good News. He offers us life without end for those who believe in Him and keep His Word. It is the 'good news' to make all bad news seem trivial. It is the phone ringing in the death house at the 11th hour with a pardon from the governor. It is your doctor shaking his head and saying, "Somehow, the X-Rays were mixed up. There's no cancer after all.!" Along that line, let me tell you a true story during WW II as told by a Protestant minister some years ago, the Rev. James Collins.

As an army chaplain, one of his duties was to inform the next of kin of a soldier's death. One day, he was told to visit a mother whose son had been reported missing in action., then declared dead, although they never found him. The chaplain and a captain drove to the mother's home to give her the news. They knocked on the door and when she answered, the chaplain identified himself and gave her the grim story that her son gave his life for his country and ...the mother fell apart and began crying uncontrollably. He said nothing and put his arms around her and held her tight.


The days passed and that family went through their grieving process. They had a funeral, complete with military honors for their son. They even put a grave marker in place even though they didn't have a body as the young man's remains were never recovered. After several months, the War Department realized that a mistake had been made. Her son was alive! He'd been found in a hospital in Europe. The Chaplain was notified and he'd been told to inform the mother that her son was alive. The chaplain had never been so happy or excited as he drove to her home. This is the greatest news you could ever give to someone with, perhaps the exception of this: JESUS IS ALIVE! He rose from the tomb! The Resurrection turns death into life; it is night turning to day.

I conclude with a few words which I've taken from Fr. John Reinkemeyer's Journal: "The Resurrection of Jesus was a hidden event. Jesus didn't rise from the grave to baffle His opponents or to make a victory statement. He rose as a sign to those who followed Him that God's Divine Love is stronger than death. Christ outlasted the empire that crucified Him. He will outlast the dictators who defy Him today." I hope you have a Blessed Easter. --Marcel Normand
