THE SEARCH FOR REAL LOVE

Most everyone, if they care to admit it, is searching for real love. You've heard the expression, "In the spring, a young man's fancy turns to love." There's a lot of truth in that statement. Young people do hunger for love: as children, they love their parents and want their parents to love them back. In adolescence, it continues as they pair off with someone. These relationships are usually short-lived because they were formed for social purposes: to gain popularity, a prom date, or just plain curiosity about the opposite sex! Entering our twenties, we become more serious. Just carnal love won't do--this is 'love' where sex is the primary motive. Of course, it can be and often is, abused, but for many, it is the door to serious dating and eventually choosing a marriage partner. Here is where we enter the realm of 'spiritual love'---where the welfare of one's partner becomes most important.

In 2014, Hollywood released a movie entitled "August: Osage County" and it described a love in its most dysfunctional form. Meryl Streep played the matriarch of the family, Violet, who, along with her three daughters, had just returned from burying her husband and the girls' father. The movie explores love in its various forms. Violet is an acid-tongued cancer patient, who radiates unhappiness. Because she has her daughters and their significant others together, she proceeds to deliver the full brunt of her stored-up venom upon them! No part of her tirade has any significance to love! Someone more clever than I once said, "love has been foolishly placed into the hands of human beings---like giving an egg to a gorilla!" Love is delicate and should be handled with care if you hope to hold on to it and/or give it to others whom you care about." This movie has superb acting quality, well-done, but it is not a happy movie, yet it reveals many truths, as Streep's character states.

A priest-friend of mine says he's met many people in his career and an overwhelming number of them appear to be unfulfilled or disappointed with their lives. Yet, we've never had more prosperity or luxuries in our history than we do today. So, the answer must lie elsewhere and I suspect it can only be found in the quality of our faith. We need to add 'meaning' to our faith.' A Christian supports a necessary law that he voted for and now upholds: This is called 'living your faith'. As to civil rights, your Christian mission is to 'see Christ' in others and help them. God gives every individual a chance to acquire faith; but it is up to the individual to work at making it real, which is done by seeing the good in helping others. Thus, we encounter solid Christians who are active in their church and volunteer to help when they see the need. We also have Christians who do the minimum. Some attend church and some do not. It requires more to be a Christian than just praying. We do for people when we LOVE enough. Think of what you do at home for your wife, husband, children, elderly parents--you do it because you LOVE them. Then, why do we have to be coerced or forced to LOVE God enough to 'do it for Him?' Adults make children 'receivers' rather than 'givers' from the time they're babies. We must teach them how to GIVE for they already know how to receive! It has been proven that getting involved in the parish INCREASES OUR FAITH and can produce unbelievable results! Fr. John Reinkemeyer once said that if ALL Catholics LIVED THEIR FAITH, as they should, within five years, the world could be All Catholic! We don't know for we've never tried it. ---Marcel Normand
