UNCHANGED RULES IN A CHANGING WORLD

We live in a world where things change rapidly. During the first half of my life, you could go to a store, buy an item that you liked and know that a similar one would be there when you again need it. Today, if I purchase a comb that works great for me or a box of cereal that I enjoy, I know when I return to that store, there's a 50% chance that there will be different combs on display and perhaps that cereal will be out of stock. You folks of a certain age know what I'm talking about---we cannot depend on buying that same product the next time we're at the store. In this fast-changing world we live in, we ask ourselves, 'are there any FIXED RULES that we can follow and know they will remain unchanged?' I scanned several religious books of our faith and arrived at FOUR FIXED TRUTHS on living the Catholic faith that we can depend upon.

1)The dignity of the individual. There is some of Christ in every one of us. It must be respected and acknowledged by all human beings. Again, this TRUTH is held by people of our faith, not necessarily the entire world, we wish...

2)The attitude of dealing with one another with LOVE. You can never go wrong here. St.Paul spoke of the three great virtues of faith, hope, and love. Faith is only temporary, for someday we won't need it. The same applies to HOPE. You will have realized both of these after death. But love, it is the greatest of all virtues. There is a case study of a Mongoloid child--a living vegetable so to speak, who responded to none of the physical attempts by doctors & psychologists. He would just lie there. Yet, when a certain nurse would attend to him---brush his hair, touch his face--he would smile and respond. When the world has lost everything, it will ALWAYS respond to LOVE. And love is something that SO MANY PEOPLE in our world long for desperately!

3)There is a larger purpose beyond life. We might as well become accustomed to it and submit to it. We aren't placed here to just 'live', for life isn't put together right for any individual, unless he or she uses it OUTSIDE of himself or herself. Our lives must have PURPOSE or we won't be happy! This is a definite truism of life.

4)THE BIG ONE! In all of life, there is something real beyond ourselves. (God) is the major one. We KNOW God is around us & that he made the world.
