MAN IS FOR GOD


God created the world. He also created you and me. What we have, we received from God. As people, we are basically 'selfish'. Most of our actions are directed toward our benefit-even our charity! A major reason that we participate in charity is to advance our holiness which can bring salvation to us. Why are you sitting in Church today? To learn more about the faith and to become a better Catholic so you might increase your chances of seeing & knowing God. You're doing it for YOURSELF! Why do I write this column each week? I say that I'm doing it because I care about the parish, and I do, but in all honesty, I'm doing it because it gives me pleasure to KNOW that I may be advancing others in the faith. In some way, this should bring me closer to Christ. Since this is my hope, I admit that it is a selfish motivation. For the most part, our lives are directed this way. We go to school & study to learn a skill so we can acquire a diploma, get a good job, and make money to get the things WE WANT! We should feel no shame in these actions. We do this because that's the way God made us. It is our basic nature. The Bible says, "God made man in His image" and God appears to be the most selfish! Think about it. He made the world for Himself and man was placed here to glorify Him. God wants our everlasting gratitude and most of God's followers are, indeed, grateful for all the benefits He has thrust upon them, His children. There is a right kind of selfishness--one that is directed to one's salvation through helping others. By this measure the SAINT is the most selfish of all--devoting his entire life to prayer and fasting so he might reach heaven and know God fully, yet as he follows this sincere motive, he guides many toward God and teaches them who God is and how we should relate to Him.

Fr. John Reinkemeyer used a small chart during our Catholic instruction, to illustrate that MAN IS FOR GOD. Father wrote on the blackboard 5 Steps of God's plan of creation. At the bottom, #5, he wrote 'physical earth' stones, etc; #4 was Plants; # 3 was Animals; # 2 was Man; and # 1 was God. He proceeded to explain that each was created in its own time:

God created the physical aspects of earth first--hills, rocks, mountains. Next, came the Plants. They looked to the earth for their food and life. Next, Animals were created and they feed on plants. Then, God created Man in his loneliness and animals are for Man. At the top of the small chart is # 1 God. Man is for God and he should thrive on his Creator. Father R. told us that you could teach the 10 Commandments from this chart. Ex: When you steal, you remove your gaze from God and go down to stones (could be jewelry being stolen) when your aim should be focused on God and His Commandments. When you commit adultery/fornication, you place too great an attachment to another person when you should be aiming toward God. The very definition of SIN is loving created things too much, and out of order. Set up this simple chart on a sheet of paper with God at the top and the rocks at the bottom. Notice the ORDER that God places in each of them. Make this part of your religious thinking and you'll most likely try to remain within ---Marcel Normand God's plan.
