FAITH AND THE BLESSED TRINITY

In earlier columns, we've said that faith is a free gift from God. It is a mystery, known only to God, why He offers faith in different ways to different people. The ordinary way is through Baptism, yet it remains a mystery why some of us receive faith through Baptism in infancy, while others get it only later in life.

We use the word 'convert' for those who come into the Church as adults, as Helen and I did in 1964. Yet, even those who have received faith through Baptism as infants must, in a sense, be 'converted' in later life. Receiving the faith and KNOWING the faith are two different things. The child receives the faith at Baptism, but to know it, he must learn what the faith is about. Each of us has some type of encounter with God before he knows what God wants of him. After the encounter and the individual rebuilds his life, this is his RESPONSE to God. The response can be dramatic like Saul's fall from his horse or perhaps a more subtle declaration like St. Francis of Assisi in the Chapel of St. Mary of the Angels. Often, faith comes from a CRISIS in a person's life----the death of a loved one, a serious illness or a narrow escape from injury or death. Other origins include advice from a priest during Confession or something said in a homily during Mass.

In most cases, this encounter with God comes about unnoticed---God gently draws a soul to a gradual realization of his relationship to God by a series of interior graces. All the person knows is that he now realizes more clearly that his life should be more God-centered. The Holy Spirit will bring him to maturity as a Christian and form Christ in him.

Now comes the time we should explore the POWER of the Holy Spirit in this divine triangle. Most of us laity do not understand it well. Many of the learned clergy find it challenging to explain. Keep in mind, it is NOT a human thing--it is GOD"S PLAN for salvation. Let's start very easy: God became Man in the Person of Christ. In God, there are THREE DIVINE PERSONS. The Old Testament said nothing of this. What were some of the previous thoughts about God? In the pagan world, Greek philosopher Plato (4th century, B.C.) felt that the only reality was God because everything else in the world died. Nothing could survive without Him. He first ventured the thought that if God is God, what was He doing all alone before He made the world? Evidence indicates that He was NOT ALONE. In the Old Testament, God said: "Let US make Man in OUR own image and likeness." Such phrases as 'holy, holy, holy' were used in prayers & psalms which anticipates THREE PERSONS in one God. In the New Testament, the best reference is Christ's own words in Matthew 28:19 "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the FATHER, and of the SON, and of the HOLY SPIRIT.' Recall that Christ placed ALL THREE on EQUAL FOOTING. So, the data is there, but the word, 'trinity' is not! This has become a debatable point between Catholics and some Protestants. As Catholics, we may not understand this mystery, yet we believe it as a matter of faith because God revealed it. Next time, we'll look further into the Holy Trinity for a better understanding. --Marcel Normand


