THE TRINITY AND THE HUMAN SOUL

We closed last week admitting that, as Catholics, we do not fully understand the Trinity, yet, we believe it as a matter of faith because God revealed it. We say we can't comprehend the Trinity; well, we shouldn't get too upset for <u>not</u> grasping this great mystery - --many of us can't even understand our husbands or wives! Even our own extended family who attended reunions cause us to gasp and think, "I didn't know he or she was that bigoted!" We learn new things about family members and we still cannot figure them out! How hard, then, it must be for men and women to know God totally. The answer is: they cannot. We believe as a matter of faith.

In speaking of the Blessed Trinity, we can know the three Persons if we recall that God has assigned each a specific work: The Father (God) <u>creates</u>, the Son <u>redeems</u>, and the Holy Spirit <u>sanctifies</u> (raising above the human to the supernatural order, giving us a share in God's nature). Let's look at God's role. He <u>creates</u>. He expresses Himself in the matter or objects that He makes. Just like an architect reveals himself in the buildings he designs, God does the same. Notice when reading the Bible, God will make statements (which apostles later put into the Bible) in 3's such as when He explains the Trinity, at Mass when we say: 'holy, holy, holy' 3 times. There are many more such moments. Remember: God <u>IS</u> knowledge--He doesn't <u>HAVE</u> it; He <u>IS IT!</u> The rest of humanity and lower life <u>HAVE</u> knowledge. God <u>IS</u>. Knowledge <u>CAUSES</u> action. A farmer knows about irrigation (knowledge), so he works to save his crops. A mother knows how to sew well (knowledge). She can make a shirt for her husband and son; a dress for her daughter. A man gains the skill for building bridges, thus we have the Golden Gate in San Francisco and the George Washington in New York City plus the Royal Gorge Bridge in Colorado.

As we analyze the <u>Human Soul</u> that God gave each of us, there is a lesson which can be likened to the nature of the Trinity. Once again, we see God operating in 3's: Imagine your own soul for a moment -- it is the highest entity (existence) that God has made on earth. It is a <u>spiritual</u> substance (invisible yet alive). The only <u>tangible</u> thing we have in the spiritual world is a 'thought'. I know that I <u>have</u> a thought, but I can't <u>see</u> it, <u>hear</u>, or <u>touch</u> it. If I don't <u>express</u> it (aloud or on paper) it is lost. Where do these thoughts come from? To answer this question will take us to that human soul we spoke of that God <u>created</u>, again using 3's to express Himself to us. Our souls have <u>three parts</u>: consisting of the Memory, the Will, and the Intellect, each with its own powers. I'll discuss these next week. --Marcel Normand
