THE HUMAN MIND IS, IN REALITY, OUR IMMORTAL SOUL

Men and women are human beings created by God and composed of body and soul and made to God's image and likeness. Some scientists believe that Man evolved from a lower form; yet many Christian clerics insist that God created the body as well. We aren't certain what early Man looked like since we haven't really seen Adam, the first man. Assuredly, he didn't look like Brad Pitt! We've all seen pictures of early Man in world history books and he looked and acted differently from today's modern Man. However, the SOUL, being intangible, did NOT evolve since it was created DI-RECTLY BY GOD. It is in HIS SOUL that we say that Man was made in the image and likeness of God.

As we stated last week, thoughts aren't created - - they originate from our senses (eyes, ears, nose, etc). Nothing enters the mind but that it has come from the brain, for the brain is a MATERIAL substance and SPIRITUAL things (like thoughts) do not come from the MATERIAL. The brain, itself, cannot think. It is a mass of tissue, nerves, and blood vessels. The brain serves as a great distributor for our thoughts. When we touch a hot stove, we immediately think 'hot' and a message is channeled down the correct nerve path and we life our hand! The brain just follows orders from the Mind (or as we can say, the soul). In reality, that is what the human mind is - our immortal soul. The mind (soul) is intangible; it cannot be removed by surgery. It is that spark of Divinity that resides within us. It is that small bit of Christ that is in ALL OF US! Remember that: If Christ is in all human beings, then no human being has the right to bring harm against another, for when you reject another, you are rejecting CHRIST, HIMSELF!

Taking a closer look at the SOUL, it has three different powers (parts), once again reminding us how God works in three(s): Memory, Intellect, and Will. Looking at MEMORY first: Everything you have learned so far in you lifetime, is stored there. Memory, because it absorbs, is called a 'passive' power. At your death, the soul will leave your body (some say within 15 to 20 min.), taking with it the knowledge you have given it in your lifetime. Each of us is responsible for the type of knowledge we give our souls through the senses (eyes, ears, nose, etc). This is why it is very important to learn all you can of God's Truths while you live. How? Reading religious books, listening to homilies at Mass, religious films, and the talks that Bishop Kemme writes in the Advance. If you don't receive the Advance, you should. It is free to all Catholics simply by asking Father to place you on the mailing list. Learn all you can about our Creator, God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Fill your Memory Bank with good, Catholic material, memorize your main prayers used at Mass, and read the 'Lives of the Saints'! Fr. Reinkemeyer said, "if you read their lives, you won't be strangers when you get there. You'll recognize them as friends." Keep in mind that ETERNITY is a long time. The power of THINKING remains with you after death.

The second part of the Soul is INTELLECT. The last two powers of the Soul are 'active' parts while the first part, Memory, is passive, meaning that it mainly absorbs. With Intellect, its object is Truth. It often asks, "Is it true?", then comes to an active decision on that basis. With Memory, we absorb; with Intellect, we think. Ultimately, Intellect will decide 'what' is to be remembered. The third part of the Soul is WILL, or some say, FREE WILL, which God gave to each of us. Where the Intellect seeks Truth, the object of the Will asks, "Is it Good?" The voice you hear, or argue with, during difficult moral decisions, is the WILL of your Soul trying to steer you 'to the good'. IT SERVES AS YOUR CONSCIENCE!! This Free Will decides if you will love God or not, if you will promote abortion or not, if you'll choose good over evil.

Dismiss those who tell you the SOUL is not immortal. We have a workable mind within the soul. We can reflect, reason, plan, make judgments and remember. The soul is <u>spiritual,</u> given to us by God at out conception. Don't take it lightly. It will be your companion after death. -- Marcel Normand
