### THE CATHOLIC BIBLE: ITS ORIGINS AND DIVISIONS THE OLD TESTAMENT

The Catholic Bible is the story of Man's revelation in history, written by men, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Their messages are contained in the Old and New Testaments. Religious scholars often describe the Old Testament as the part of the Bible written before God sent His Son to live as a man upon the earth. As said, the writers were 'inspired' by God. By a supernatural influence, God enlightened their minds and moved their wills to write. They acted as free instruments of God who directed and preserved them from error. The writers weren't 'passive instruments'--they brought their own personalities into what they wrote. They were like skilled painters who sketched from the same model. The 'products' (writings) are similar, but with differences according to their talents. The principal author of the Bible is God. and the human beings who wrote it were His free rational instruments. Since God is the chief author, there couldn't have been any mistakes in the original texts. This is why the Bible is often called 'the written word of God'. Because it is His written Word, the Bible is treated with great reverence. This is why government officials take their solemn oaths of office on this Book.

The Holy Catholic Bible is made up of 72 Books: 45 known as the Old Testament and 27 that form the New Testament. These books were composed by many different writers in at least three different languages: Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek. The time span when all of this writing occurred began in Moses' time when he rescued the Israelites from slavery in Egypt---all the way until St. John, the Evangelist, the last Apostle who wrote his gospel in the New Testament toward the end of his long life, perhaps 100 A.D. (anno domini, meaning 'In the Year of our Lord').

The word, Testament, means a 'testimonial' or making a formal statement of one's beliefs as Matthew and other gospel writers did in the New Testament. Early church fathers such as Augustine and David, did the same by testifying to a Truth that came to them and writing it on paper or papyrus.

The 45 Books of the Old Testament are divided into three parts: 1) the Historical section has 21 of the 45 Books relating to the earliest ages of the world such as the 5 Books of Moses and the miracles that God performed to prepare Man for the Coming of Christ; 2) the Prophetic part tells the story of holy teachers called the prophets, sent by God to announce His Will to men. 17 of the 45 Books are in this category such as Jeremiah and Isaiah; 3) Doctrinal Books make up the third section and there are 7 of these Books, composed of Maxims (rules of conduct) and prayers such as Proverbs and the Psalms. This group is often referred to as the Books of Wisdom, giving practical ways to understand God and walk in the correct Path. We'll discuss the New Testament next time.

#### STEWARDSHIP REFLECTIONS

Heirlooming

Is 55:10-11 / Ps 65:10, 11, 12-13, 14 / Rom 8:18-23 / Mt 13:1-23

Ever heard of heirloom seeds? Heirloom seeds are passed down from the previous season's plants—for over 50 years! Typically, the plant and fruit experienced the year before, will be the similar experience in the following years—if you save the seeds, or let them self-propagate. Hybrid seeds on the other hand, might only produce a harvest the first year, and after that, who knows. The Stewardship model in our diocese began in 1985—not quite an heirloom, but it has continued to produce the kind of fruit our Lord described in today's Gospel.

#### MASS INTENTIONS

WHY REQUEST A MASS INTENTION? One part of Catholic culture that is sometimes hard to understand and very often misunderstood is the custom of offering Mass intentions. The Church considers the Mass to be one of the greatest prayers of intercession. When a priest celebrates Mass each day, he offers each Mass for a particular intention. By doing so he applies special graces from God upon that person or intention. That intention can be for a living person's health and well-being, or for the eternal rest of a deceased person, or any other prayers you wish to be offered up to Christ for a loved one. Pope Paul VI said, "The Mass is the most perfect form of prayer!" It has immense power and countless miracles and conversions have occurred throughout the centuries by offering Masses for a specific intention or person. Mass intentions are a great treasure of the Church and have a spiritual weight that is incalculable. Requesting Mass Intentions: Mass intentions make beautiful gifts for any special occasion: birthday, anniversary, in thanksgiving for a prayer answered, an intention for someone who is struggling with a serious illness or other life trauma. If you have a particular date or time on which you want the Mass, you need to turn in the information at least a month in advance (Masses are scheduled that much ahead of time). Call the parish office to schedule OR place the information of who or what the Mass is for, and who is offering the Mass, along with a phone number in case we have questions. The suggested stipend for Mass intentions is \$10.00 payable via cash or check, you can donate less or more.
