THE NEW TESTAMENT: GUARDIAN OF THE BIBLE

To recap from last week, the Bible is the Word of God in the words of men. The Bible is a 'Library', consisting of many Books: On the lst floor of the library are the Books produced by Israel (Old Testament), while on the 2nd floor, those Books were produced by the early Church and written on paper in the years following Jesus' Ascension.

The New Testament consists of 27 Books written in the first century. It consists of 3 Basic Parts: 1) the EPISTLES, or letters, most of which were written by St. Paul who explained the New Church and the kind of response that Man should make to it; 2) the GOSPELS, consisting of 4 accounts of what Christ did and said while on earth and written by Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John; and 3) OTHER WORKS, including the ACTS OF THE APOSTLES by Luke, describing the early history of the Church and the APOCALYPSE, written by John, a prophetic (divinely inspired) describing the Heavenly Glory of Christ.

Matthew wrote the life of Christ as HE saw it. He didn't record everything, just the events he thought were significant. He wrote on sheepskin, and as time elapsed, these writings aged and had to be re-copied. Many times, during the recopying, the cleric would 'add' to what the original writer had recorded. The 'addition' did not necessarily change the gospel drastically, but made it difficult to decide which part was the original. Often, the changes made were due to substitutions, made for words which had become illegible (poor printing) with the passing of time.

As centuries passed, others began writing the 'good news' from what THEY had heard from the apostles and the so-called New Testament grew in size! Around 350 A.D. the Church scholars began to study the Books of the New Testament in order to sift out what they considered AUTHENIC and discard the remainder. After their study, 42 books were thrown out as not inspired by God. By the year 397 A.D., the Church was prepared to declare that the Bible consisted of a total of 72 Books. This Declaration was made at the Council of Carthage, North Africa.

Earlier, Pope Damascus I directed the brilliant church scholar, Jerome, to begin the translations of the Gospels into Latin, which was the common tongue of the people. His translation was completed and became known as the VUL-GATE EDITION, meaning 'for the common people'. Jerome was known for his accuracy, not beauty of style. However, his translation is respected by all church scholars. For the next 1000 years, the Catholic Church became the 'Guardian of the Bible' amid all of the handwritten copies made throughout the region of southern Europe and Africa. These so-called 'authentic' copies spread through the region and only the Church had the original words of the early fathers. We'll trace some of the obstacles to accuracy as 'Bibles' continued to appear. --Marcel Normand
