KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

The Knights of Columbus will meet on Tuesday, August 1st at 7:00pm in St. Michael's Hall.

The Catholic Church teaches that when the Pope & his Bishops are in Council, like Carthage or Vatican II, they are guided by the Holy Spirit. Our faith is in the Council at work and that these clerics make no errors. The word for such a belief is 'Infallible'. The term, when used in context with the Catholic Church, means by special assistance of the Holy Spirit, it CANNOT error when it teaches or believes a doctrine of faith or morals. Christ promised, "I am with you all days, even unto the consummation of the world." If Christ is with the Church all days, it cannot err in teaching: it cannot lead the people away from God. No Christian denies that the Apostles were infallible. In fact, in the first century, they were the only authority in the Church. The Bible was not completed until the end of that century, nor was it within reach of all people. An infallible Bible is of no use without an infallible interpreter. History has proved this when we note how many Christian denominations have risen that deny the infallibility of the Catholic Church. By infallibility, the faithful know exactly what to believe and what to do in order that they may be pleasing to God and save their souls.

THE CATHOLIC CHURCH; GUARDIAN OF THE BIBLE

All Christian revelation comes to us from two sources: 1) God's Eternal Word in the Bible; and 2) the oral teachings of the apostles and their successors, known as TRADITION. Tradition means the handing down of revealed Truths, by word of mouth. This, the Apostles did, for the Gospel was PREACHED before there were any written Gospels. The written records of Tradition can be found in the Decrees of Popes, Councils, and the writings of Church Fathers. A good example of 'Council' would be the Vatican Council II, convened by St. John XXIII which lasted for 4 sessions from 1962 to 1965. It produced a series of documents to direct the life of the Church in the 20th century and beyond.

Returning to our main theme of a written Bible, once the Church had established an 'Official' Bible, the problem was that of duplicating it for use by the clergy. Copies were so difficult to obtain that many clerics had to share; therefore, it was rare for the faithful to have copies in their homes. You would hear the Word of God at the celebration of Mass. There were many monks who were intelligent enough to make EXACT copies of the Bible through the difficult process of longhand. Some of these monks literally lost their eyesight by spending most of their lives copying the Bible. Monks often enriched their work with pictures and comments. Often, it took as much as twelve years to make one copy!

All through the Middle Ages, the Church guarded the Holy Bible and made as many duplications of it as they could. Empires rose and fell during this period. Wars devastated Europe. Sacred buildings, public libraries, centers of knowledge & documents were destroyed. But, the Church and the Holy Bible remained intact. Christ had told Peter, the lead Apostle and first Pope: ".....upon this rock I will build my Church and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.." Matt 16:18-19. Big changes occurred in the 15th Century when the printing press was invented. We'll continue there. --Marcel Normand
