## DESIGNED BY GOD, WE OFTEN FALL SHORT IN FULFILLING HIS WILL

Most of us come to realize sometime during our journey on earth, that we were truly designed by God. He planned for us to be a beautiful reflection of Him, that every small detail that makes us who we are, our body shape, personality and intellect were purposefully woven together by Him. What you'd do with the money would be far more important. Taylor Swift makes millions, but she can do only so much when it comes to enjoyment. What becomes of the remainder of her efforts? Probably, if she decided to use ALL of her earnings for pleasure, her mortal soul might be endangered! Fame just means that strangers stare at you and think you don't have feelings! I haven't seen where fame has really helped Lindsay Lohan or Justin Bieber. Queen Elizabeth II of Great Britain had fame and who were her close friends? her maid? the gentleman who brought her food on a tray? Famous people usually have many 'acquaintances' but few close friends. Ask most young people who they consider famous and they will list entertainment people or athletes. Few would list spiritual leaders or inventors, certainly not most political leaders!!

However, the kids aren't completely to blame. If they worship money, it's because most adults do also. If they crave gadgets and fast cars, again, many adults pay homage to them too. An old maxim can explain this: 'the apple doesn't fall far from the tree!' Of course, fame, money, and power play a big role in our lives and each of them, if used sensibly, can make life worth living. To remain positive, they must be relegated to their proper importance. God has given us all these motivators to help us on our journey to Him and expects us to use them properly and not give them prime importance to our lives.

To sum it up, we've been uniquely formed by Our Creator and given breath by the touch of His hand. He loves us and is delighted when we give Him worship and praise. We are the 'poetry of God', His magnificent design. Our identity is connected to His Grace. We should hear more about our formation, for such understanding could result in more awareness of our purpose here--to serve God. Keep in mind that doing good and living wisely would be serving God.
