

Understanding the Mass (by Father Vacca)

As the priest arrives at the sanctuary during the Entrance procession of the Mass, he and the ministers genuflect to our Lord's presence in the Blessed Sacrament. He will do so again at the end of Mass upon leaving the sanctuary. The only time this is not done is when the tabernacle is not kept in the sanctuary or when it is empty as on Good Friday.

Every Catholic genuflects upon entering and leaving the church to acknowledge our Lord's presence. It's a way of saying "Hello, Jesus" and "Goodbye, Jesus". We remember that this is His house that we have entered and He is at home. The burning red sanctuary candle tells us that He is here; we can speak to Him in prayer for He is present in the tabernacle.

Once we have acknowledged His presence there is no need to genuflect again as we move about the church or the sanctuary until we are ready to leave. Ministers moving within the sanctuary during Mass are directed to simply bow. The priest will genuflect again at the Consecration when our Lord is newly made present on the altar and when closing the tabernacle. But it is always to our Lord & King that we bend the knee and to no one else.

PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY: HONORING THE SERVANTS OF GOD

September 24, this weekend, is designated as Priesthood Sunday when Catholics recognize their parish priest and all priests serving God. The Catholic Advance took a statement from Hebrews 5:4 saying "No one takes this honor upon himself, but only when CALLED BY GOD." Priests have said that they 'felt the nudge from God' while making this discernment. Helen and I are converts to Catholicism, entering the Church in our twenties. I've known many priests since then --those who pastored here and many whom I've met while attending conferences in Wichita. I've only known a few bishops---strong resolute men like Bishops Carroll, Byrne, Maloney, Gerber, Olmstead, Jackels, and our present bishop, Carl A. Kemme. We've had outstanding priests here at St. Joseph's. First, coming to mind, for me of course, was Fr. John Reinkemeyer because he instructed us and brought us into the Church in 1964. His homilies were often basic catechism. Other priests whom I remember well included Fr. Thissen, Fr. McElwee, and Fr. Lumbre to name a few. Through their homilies, these priests always left us with serious thoughts to reflect upon or apply to our lives, much like our present pastor, Fr. Vacca. He doesn't speak at length, but it is telling that each word was planned for us to know Jesus better!

There are coincidences that have occurred between our Wichita Diocese & the Jefferson City Diocese of Mo. Those of you who read the Catholic Advance perhaps know Mr. Christopher Riggs, its quality editor who runs a tight ship and demands a good quality newspaper. To most of you, no doubt, the Jefferson City diocesan publication is less familiar. The editor there is Mr. Jay Nies (pronounced 'nease'), a friend of mine, due to our mutual friend, Fr. Reinkemeyer, who grew up in Rich Fountain, Mo. within the Jeff City Diocese. Mr. Nies is similar to Mr. Riggs when it comes to the philosophy of editing a religious newspaper. He's very exact, thoughtful, and has a knack when it comes to feature stories about locals in his diocese. He has known Fr. Reinkemeyer for decades and whenever Father came home to Rich Fountain to celebrate Mass in his home church, Sacred Heart, Mr. Nies would come to visit him. The present bishop of the Jeff City Diocese, W. Shawn McKnight, was a priest from the Wichita Diocese when he was named a Bishop in 2017. Fr. Reinkemeyer knew him well because Fr. McKnight's family lived in Kingman, Ks, while Fr. Reinkemeyer was pastor of St. Patrick's Church there. He saw him grow up & become an excellent priest in his own right. Fr. Reinkemeyer once predicted to his secretary, Doris Brand: "Watch that Fr. McKnight. He's going to be a bishop someday." Some 15 yrs later, when Pope Francis appointed Fr. McKnight in 2017 to succeed Bishop John Gaydo as Bishop of Jeff City Diocese, Doris Brand made a phone call to Jay Nies, editor of the CATHOLIC MISSOURIAN a few hours after the Pope's announcement. She told Jay that when she heard the good news, she smiled. looked up to heaven and said to Fr. Reinkemeyer, who had died in 2012, "You had something to do with this, didn't you?" This is but one of the many connections that the two dioceses have. Doris recalled a priest friend of Fr. Reinkemeyer's, once noted: "There are no coincidences in God's design."

And so, on this Priesthood Sunday, we must renew our gratitude to all of our priests who are servants of God. They're on call 24/7 each day. everyday, whenever we need them. Despite the burdens, young men continue to think and pray about the possibility that God wants them. God speaks loudly; hopefully, young men will hear Him. And we at St. Michael's and St. Joseph's wish to thank Fr. Vacca for his notable service and outstanding homilies to us, his parishioners.
