

Understanding the Mass (by Father Vacca)

#4 As Father leads the Introductory Rites, we begin with the Sign of the Cross. It is a prayer unto itself and a profession of our faith in the Trinity.

Catholics are not the only ones to use this gesture; Anglicans and Orthodox also make the Sign of the Cross. The cross, for us, is not a negative symbol, for we rejoice in the Cross by which we were saved. It is a sign of God's love for us.

Then Father greets the people as St. Paul does in many of the New Testament letters. It is either simple: "The Lord be with you." Or it can be more elaborate: "The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all."


The response – "and with your spirit" – has been the Latin response for centuries. Our modern thinking doesn't appreciate the classical distinction that we are made up of body, soul and spirit. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me" means that His Spirit accompanies my spirit, and so we wish for everyone that the Lord be with your spirit.

BEING A CATHOLIC ISN'T EASY

Life was easier as a child, remember? Your imagination could take you anywhere & you enjoyed your trip. A ten year old could sit in Dad's truck and pretend he was Dad. He'd put his hands on the steering wheel & dream he was driving to see his friend, yet in reality, the gear was in PARK and he wasn't going anywhere! Relating this to faith, I think that some believers are 'parked' like the little kid, going nowhere. Their plan is to reach Heaven, but they have their gearshift in P.

Many of us are what is known as 'born Catholics' because our parents & grandparents were Catholic. Others choose to be Catholic and have accepted the doctrines of the faith and were baptized into the Church. Few of us have our lives planned entirely by ourselves. Oftentimes, they're planned by God, regardless of our approval. In our daily living, most of us attempt to do God's will as we know it, yet may find ourselves doing things we never expected to do. We come to church on the weekend---something within our control, but other times, we're surprised at what we are doing, maybe something we hadn't arranged to do, such as taking a neighbor to the hospital or accompanying our daughter to traffic court!

To be alive is to grow and change. Things never stay the same as you well know. That 'turkey & Swiss' that you planned to order last night at Arby's? You were told by the clerk that it had been removed from the menu! That special bread that you've been buying at Dillons? You learned that they stopped making it. Choosing a vocation may be so challenging that it may require much effort & study before making the final decision.

Many Catholics would say that it's hard to be a Catholic in this secular world because of the demands which are expected of us---our time, intellect, talent, and treasure. Oftentimes, becoming a Catholic can bring division within a family--dad may object to his son joining the church or a parent may exert pressure on their daughter to raise their children in the Church despite her husband's doubts. Division can also occur within an individual, himself, as he ponders admittance to the Catholic Church---a battle between his heart and his head. This could bring about much distress. Fr. Bob McElwee of our diocese once told me, "Joining a church should be like finding shoes that fit. It feels right to you." Good advice may be to visit with your priest either socially in his office or privately in the confessional.

Following God's plan isn't always easy; however, we have no other option if spending eternity with Him is our goal. It's up to each of us to discern God's will as He attempts to lead us to Heaven.

Personally, I've always felt that you don't just 'join a church'; you have to make a serious conversion, perhaps changing habits and even cultural values in order to recognize the road you must take to save your soul, which should be one's primary objective as a serious Catholic. The Church gives us God's message: We are loved! Nails didn't hold Jesus on the Cross; His love for us kept Him there. We're lovable because God loved us first. So you see, if you want to make your life mean something, there's work to do and first, we must get our lives out of P (park) and listen to the Lord. Our faith is the 'light at the end of the tunnel' that will ultimately show us the way to Heaven.
