



Understanding the Mass (by Father Vacca)

#7 The Glory to God is not used on Sundays of Lent or Advent. It begins with the song of the angels when Christ was born, and so it is for joyful occasions – feasts. It is a hymn, which is why it is more appropriate to sing it, especially during Christmas and Easter seasons.

It is also used on the Ordinary Sundays of the year. Easter is the most important feast of the Church, but every Sunday is like a mini-Easter when we celebrate anew the Resurrection of the Lord. Sunday became the Lord's Day for the early Christians, also known as the eighth day.

The Jewish Sabbath is Saturday - the day of rest, for God "rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had done." The Third Commandment for Jews pertains to the Sabbath, but the Resurrection event on the eighth day points to eternal life, a day that will never end, and so Christians keep the Third Commandment by observing each Sunday the day of the Lord's rising from the dead.

FORGIVENESS; THE GREATEST ACT OF LOVE

Jesus is the one who told us that forgiveness is the greatest act of love. His death on the Cross was an act of love and forgiveness of our sins. When you forgive, you die to self. St. Paul told the Romans, "none of us lives as his own master and none of us dies as his own master." That statement is very counter-cultural, for it is not the so-called popular way. Contrary to pro-choice thinking, God is the author of life. Also, opposed to Dr. Kevorkian. a popular euthanasia supporter, God is still the Master of death! Every moment of life we have is entrusted to us by God to give back to Him.

You may recall a gospel parable not long ago when Jesus was presented this question: "How often must I forgive my brother?" We've all asked this, for it is a common human question. Peter offered "7 times". Jesus said, "7 times 7" because He wanted His listeners to realize that there's NO LIMIT TO FOGIVENESS! Think about it. God doesn't put a limit on His forgiveness of us. Examples are: the "Our Father" and "the Beatitudes". You may remember the parable of the heartless king, who, when settling his accounts, noted that some of his servants had squandered his assets. When they begged forgiveness, the king denied them. Servants who witnessed this were badly shaken. Don't we all, if we seek forgiveness and it is not forth-coming? It is a powerful story and, like most parables, it was about you and me. Jesus is telling us in this short narrative that His Heavenly Father will treat us the same way, unless we FORGIVE from our hearts.

The day we were brought to Holy Mother Church for Baptism, we were IN DEBT with Original Sin. He washed it away. Then, as our former pastor, Fr. Donald Thissen told us years ago, "He gave each of us \$9 million worth of grace to aid us through our lives." The Sacrament of Penance (Reconciliation, Confession,) restores us to our original innocence at baptism. Think for a moment how blessed we are to have a church to attend and hear the Word of God spoken to us by a PRIEST! Many places in the world may have a building to go to, but priests are scarce and others fill in with the readings. We should take this opportunity to model to the world through our actions to teach and inform. Bishop Fulton Sheen once said in a homily: "We can cure illnesses with our kind words and deeds." Don't you respond when a stranger looks toward you with a smile and perhaps a kind word? Of course you do! There are so many who do not, that makes it a rarity in today's world. But, in negative contrast, do we commit acts that harm the meaning Christ portrayed when He hung on the Cross? Think of the numerous times and events that have negated His love: wars, depression, the A-bomb, the current Hamas-Israeli War, abortion. What meaning can life have if we destroy it at its beginning? Daily life teaches us forgiveness if we observe. How many of our thoughts and actions go awry (wrong) each day? We need forgiveness.

Before concluding, we should mention two important days in our church calendar next week: All Saints Day on Nov. 1 and it is a Holy Day of Obligation. All Hallows Eve or 'Halloween' is how it is called in the secular (non-religious) world. All Saints celebrates all who have gone to Heaven. The 2nd important feast day is Nov. 2, All Souls Day, not one of obligation, but, in my estimation, a most important day for Catholics. This Mass offers us an opportunity to pray for souls in Purgatory or for all who have died--our relatives or friends and hoping for their entrance to Heaven. Speaking to the Lord is highly recommended for we need to form a close relationship with Him. It will help us face death realistically. Your love for Him increases as you learn more about Him. When two love one another, there is dying to self. Remember Nov 1 and 2--both important days for our souls.
