

WHAT IS IT ABOUT MARY?



Next week, we will celebrate the holy day, the Immaculate Conception, where the Church has declared Mary, the Mother of God, to have been conceived without sin. As practicing Catholics, we are to accept the decision of the Magisterium (teaching authority of the Church). The Immaculate Conception was officially declared in a church document in 1854. Most Christians and some Catholics find this difficult to honor. Often those who carry such positions think of Mary as Jesus' mother and she appears each Christmas in the manger, in art or in music to play the role given her.

Mary, Mother of Christ, is the most perfect mother because she was conceived without sin. We all know the meaning of motherhood, having felt the soft love of a mother which makes it difficult to say 'goodbye' or to leave home. A real mother always finds a place for the children the Lord sends her. A child may make his mother's heart ache because of his sinful ways, yet when the wayward child comes home, her face brightens! He still has a friend as long as his mother lives because the door of her heart remains wide open to him no matter what happens.

Four years after the doctrine of Her Immaculate Conception, she appeared to Bernadette, a poor French girl, at Lourdes. When asked, she replied, "I am the Immaculate Conception", which Bernadette did not understand, but repeated it to her parents. This is actual history and was recorded by witnesses. However, many remain skeptical and confused. What is it about Mary? Are we envious because God is so generous? Is she too pure for us? Perhaps too holy? Too much like we were called to be? The gospel, on this December 8 feast for Mary, recalls when the Angel Gabriel came to her, announcing her coming motherhood: "Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with thee." We understand 'full of grace' to mean that she was without sin. She was born without Original Sin. God interrupted the process when He created Mary and I don't believe the angel would have described her as 'full of grace' if God didn't approve.

Mary's faith was tested in the Seven Sorrows described in the Bible. She treasured all these things in her heart. Our earthly mothers have done the same during their lifetimes. Back to Lourdes: The greater miracle there is not that some people are physically healed thru Lourdes' healing waters; it is the fact that, though more than a century and a half has passed since Mary's appearance, over three million pilgrims come there yearly seeking spiritual strength. "For he who finds Me, finds life, and wins salvation from the Lord." Proverbs 8

Mary, the virgin maiden from Nazareth, is the Mother of God. How so? She is Christ's Mother and He is God. She is the Mother of God as He became 'Man in Time'. She prepared the human body of Christ. It was from her that the Second Divine Person took his human nature. It is described beautifully in Luke 1:26-35. Just think of the Grace that Our Lord gave each one of us--then stop to think of HOW MUCH He gave her! Think of the 'Fullness of God's favor' to ONE PERSON! God gave her virginity and motherhood at the same time--no other woman can make such a statement. This is why the "faithful" pay tribute to her. Remember, Catholics do NOT worship her, nor make a Goddess of her. They do NOT replace God or Christ with her. She is considered the holiest of all God's creatures who was sinless throughout life. Yet, she is not considered by the Church to be Divine. We 'honor' her. God, Himself, set the precedent to honor her by giving her the FIRST human knowledge of the coming of Salvation when she learned that 'Divinity' would take residence in her body for nine months. For her, Our Lord performed His first public miracle--that of changing water into wine at the wedding feast at Cana. For her, He gave His last thought as He hung dying on the Cross--He looked at her and the beloved disciple, John, and said to her: "Woman, behold your son". John 19 26-27. As the Mother of Christ, Mary is the mother of the Mystical Body of Christ, her Son's Church. If people really knew, they could understand our reverence to her. Therefore, don't let anyone mess with your Mother! Always honor her. Consider it a privilege to come Dec 8 to honor her at Holv Mass.
