

Understanding the Mass (by Father Vacca)

#14 Special honor and reverence is given to the Gospels. Since they are directly about what Jesus said and did, we stand during the Gospel proclamation. The priest kisses the Gospels; they can be incensed and carried in procession.

At the beginning of the Gospel, the priest or deacon makes the sign of the cross on the book and then on his forehead, lips and heart. The congregation also makes the sign of the cross on forehead, lips and over the heart. This is symbolic of our desire to have the Word of God remain on our minds, on our lips and in our hearts.

Before Vatican II, only the Gospel of Matthew was normally heard at Sunday Mass. But the Second Vatican Council, increased the amount of the Bible used at Mass, so that over a three-year cycle Matthew is heard one year, Mark the second year and Luke the third year. John's Gospel is used each year during Easter season and to fill in Mark's year because Mark's Gospel is so short.

Advent: A Season of Promise and Waiting

Advent guides us through Mass prayers & Readings in order to reflect on the 2nd Coming of Christ and the fullness of life & salvation that He promised the faithful. Though a short season, Advent is one of the most important for it reminds us of where we are heading and who we will see, hopefully Heaven & Jesus. We know that God the Father appointed Jesus to be our Savior & our Judge. Advent is a time of 'waiting'. If that's true, then our entire lives must be an 'advent', for we spend much of our lives 'waiting'. At one time, we waited for Santa, we wait for summertime, for when we can get our driver's license, for when we graduate from school, get a job, fall in love, children, the empty nest time, and retirement.

Our parents told us not to 'wish our lives away', yet we still do, just waiting for life to be more than what it seems to be. Last weekend, Fr. Vacca quoted from the 2nd Reading--St. Peter's words "that with the Lord, one day is like a thousand yrs. & a thousand yrs. like one day to God." Father reminded us that God is patient with us, not wishing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance. Perhaps Advent isn't about waiting for God to change our lives; maybe, Advent is about God waiting for us to come around & recognize that 'He is with us here and now!'

Noted historian C.S. Lewis, said: "If you read history, you find that the Christians who did the most for the present world were those who 'thought most of the next.' The Apostles who set forth to convert as well as many of the great thinkers of the Middle Ages (1500s) ---all left their mark on earth precisely because their minds were 'occupied with heaven'. Today, we find writers have largely ceased to think of God's world--they've become less effective. Aim at heaven and you'll get earth thrown in; aim at earth and you may get neither."

The question for each of us, then, is 'What are we waiting for at this point in our lives?' Whatever it is, no doubt there is love, joy, or peace at the heart of it. Chances are, we continue to shield a 'hunger for God' within us. Advent, with its promises, will help us discover the Truth, and if we live by it, we will cease to worry about fleeting things of this world. We will have a power from above to simply live, but do so with our eyes, minds, & hearts set on an eternity spent with Our Lord, the angels and saints. Let's try to fortify our new 'mindset' with acts of charity---make a holy hour, attend a weekday Mass, go to confession. How long has it been since you said the rosary alone? Do you still remember each mystery? All simple acts of charity, yet could be part of 'repentance' that St. John, the Baptism, warned about.

The following is a short prayer that I discovered while preparing for my catechism classes here at St. Joseph's 30 years ago: The author is unknown, but there is much food for thought in his words:

"Life is short and death is sure; the hour of death remains obscure, A soul you have and only one; if that be lost, all hope is gone. Waste not your time, while time shall last; for after death, it's ever past The all-seeing God, your judge will be; Heaven or Hell, your destiny. All earthly things will fleet away; Eternity, alone, will ever stay."

Allow extra prayer in the last days of Advent. The saints have told us if we remember the end, we will never sin. God is waiting for us to 'make the decision' to follow His path, where you will find what your heart is searching for.
