Understanding the Mass (by Father Vacca)

#20 The Prayer over the Gifts is the second of three presidential prayers. It returns to the theme for the day as the preparation of the altar is now concluded.

Besides the bread and wine, the altar now has whatever vessels are necessary to facilitate their distribution, such as the chalice – or priest's cup, if needed a ciborium which comes with a lid to hold the hosts that are to be consecrated at the Mass, and a paten – or plate – for the large host. Linens on the altar include purificators to use with the cups and the corporal, which is the center square cloth on which the bread and wine were positioned by Father after blessing them. The corporal allows for easier clean-up of drips or crumbs once the Mass is over.

The "table of the Eucharist" once set is then the focus for the community gathered for the "sacrifice of the Mass".

St. Thomas Aquinas, Doctor of the Church

St. Thomas Aguinas is known for his great love of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. His feast day will be observed by the Church on Monday, Jan. 29, since his day of observance is Jan. 28 which falls on Sunday this year. Thomas was born near Naples, Italy, in 1226. His parents wanted their son to become the Abbot, someday, of the huge Benedictine Monastery in nearby Monte Casino. He received an early start toward holiness when his father placed him with the Benedictines at age 5. He spent years studying there and at age 19, he entered the University of Naples where he was attracted to Aristotle's philosophy & joined the Order of Dominicans, much to his family's disappointment.

He left the university soon after to live with the Dominican priests. His parents took drastic steps to stop this & had his two brothers kidnap him from the Dominicans, bring him home, & locked him in the family castle for nearly a year. He finally escaped & returned to the Dominicans! Soon after, Pope Celestine IV summoned him to Rome & asked his family not to stand in their son's way of a Dominican vocation.

Thomas returned to the Dominicans & was soon sent to Cologne, Germany to study under the most respected teacher of that time--Albert, the Great. Albert, himself, would later be canonized a saint by the Church. At school, Thomas was labeled the 'Dumb Ox' by his companions because of his large size & silent manner. Later, Albert told the students, "I tell you that someday that Dumb Ox will bellow so loudly that the whole world will hear him!" History shows that it came to pass. Thomas was ordained a priest and taught as well as wrote several books on scripture, philosophy, & theology. The most famous of his books was the SUMMA THEOLOGICA, written to counter the arguments brought by pagans against Catholic theology. He spent 8 years on the SUMMA, but no single text displays his supreme wisdom more completely. The last part, he left unfinished, claiming that he wasn't satisfied with the content after having a profound mystical experience in early 1273 while saying Mass. He told his secretary, "Compared to what has been revealed to me, all that I have written seems to me like so much straw!" Pope Leo XIII, in his 1879 encyclical (papal document), officially confirmed Aquinas as the greatest theologian of the Catholic Church.

Three months later, 1273, Aquinas was summoned by Pope Gregory X to attend the Council of Lyons, France, to attempt a reconciliation between Rome & the Greek Church. He fell ill & died at his sister's house on Jan 28, 1274. He was canonized a saint in 1323 & named a Doctor of the Church in 1567. He is the Patron Saint of Catholic Schools.

His devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is best illustrated in his prayers & hymns. The best known are "Tantum Ergo" (bowing low, then offer homage....); and "O, Salutaris" (O saving victim, open-ing wide....) which are sung at the Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament. One night, while he was praying before the Blessed Sacrament, Our Lord spoke to him, saying: "You have written well of me, Thomas. What reward shall you have?" To which Thomas replied: "Nothing but Thyself, O Lord!" This is sufficient evidence of his Holiness. Such greatness & humility seldom go together!
