#18 The Bible says a great deal about money and about tithing to support the Church. "Abram gave a tenth of everything" he had.

But the Bible goes further than just implying that we give God and Church only a percentage of what we have; the Biblical attitude is that everything we have is God's. We are the ones on borrowed time; we make temporary use of God's creation. We enter this world with nothing and we leave with nothing. It is all blessing and gift from the Lord.

So when the Offertory basket passes by, it's not about what can I spare to part with; instead, it's an act of thanksgiving to God for all that we have. Like the Parable of the Talents, we give thanks for His gifts and we return it back to Him 100 or 60 or 40-fold.

The early Christians not only shared what they had with the whole community, especially those in need, but they provided the bread and wine to be used in worship. Today, we don't bring bread from home, but the Offertory gifts include the bread and wine for worship as well as our financial support for parish functioning and charity.

ML King's Legacy: A Good Lesson For All Today

On Monday, our nation will observe Martin Luther King Day. It occurs on the 3rd Monday of January each year; in fact, this MLK Day arrives exactly on his birthday! Born on Jan. 15, 1929, he would have been 95 years old. He was the son of a long line of Baptist ministers. He grew up in Atlanta, GA, at a time when Jim Crow laws, mainly in the South, made segregation & discrimination a daily reality for African Americans residing there. He attended Boston University's School of Theology & received his Doctor's Degree. He became an iconic (revered) figure of the 1960s. In August, 1963, he delivered his now famous "I Have A Dream" speech to more than 200,000 people gathered at the Lincoln Memorial in our nation's capital. Here, King stated that "all people should be judged, not by the color of their SKIN, but by the content of their CHARACTER.'

Dr. King's leadership led to the overall success of the civil rights movement of the 1960s & continues to impact civil rights today. His legacy provides us a firm model as to how to combat inequality today and we know that inequalities still exist. But in 2008, U.S. citizens elected an African American president and re-elected him in 2012. African Americans serve at all levels of government from Congress to the Supreme Court. And yet we're aware that race problems do exist today. More could be gained if we focused on improving our families & seeing to it that our children receive a good educational experience. Race problems in our nation have little to do with slavery and everything to do with the culture we live in -- TV, movies, social media and the Hollywood culture-- that often negatively influence our kids but they do very little to encourage them to a better, moral life. If he were here, ML King would be the first to lead a movement toward a better life for young people by improving the home & the school
