Understanding the Mass (by Father Vacca)

#27 Besides the four Eucharistic Prayers we've had since 1970, we now have six more that are not always found in the missalette. Two have the theme of reconciliation which are best used during Lent. The remaining four are nearly identical with thematic variations for unity of the Church, the Father's guidance through the ages, Jesus' way to the Father, or Jesus ministering to the those in need.

Since these six are not translations of ancient prayers, they are written in a more modern and easily understood manner. But like Eucharistic Prayer #4, the last four can only be used during Ordinary Time because they have their own Prefaces which is where the individual themes stand out.

St. Joseph, Husband of Our Lady

Many Catholics are familiar with the date, March 19, the feast day of St. Joseph. I think that Butler's LIVES OF THE SAINTS records his life and works very well. It marks the date of his death in the first century, perhaps when Jesus was but 30. As Catholics, we should strive to know this great saint well. His 'Heavenly birthday' as stated is March 19---a man who bent so willingly to the Divine Will. As a young man, he joyfully sacrificed his own dreams and accepted the role that God gave him--to be the foster father of His Son and spouse of the Virgin Mary. Around 900 A.D. the Church began to celebrate March 19 as Joseph's feast day after many years of scant attention. Around the 1500s, the Church began to think of Joseph as the 'provider and protector' of the Holy Family. In 1870, Pope Pius IX declared him Patron of the Universal Church. Christian artists showed him so obviously in control, not in a domineering way, but as one who had put his total trust in God. Having made his commitment and been told 'not to fear' by God Joseph went his quiet way, serving his family. We need to be reminded that Joseph was born of royal lineage. As a descendant of David, the great King of Israel, he is referred to in the Bible as the 'Son of David', a noble title also used for Jesus. The Bible tells us little about Joseph---not one recorded spoken word! But we know him because of his quiet faith & courage, his dedication to Mary, his espoused wife, & the education of Him, who though divine, loved to call Himself 'the son of man'. Jesus learned Joseph's trade of carpentry & imitated his manner of speech.

By the work of his hands, Joseph used skill to support his Holy Family. In his obedience to God, Joseph guided Mary & Jesus to Egypt and then led them to settle in Nazareth. He knew he was to protect God's greatest treasures. After Joseph & Mary were betrothed (engaged), Mary was discovered to be pregnant. Matthew's Gospel relates the story from Joseph's perspective. He is presented with a serious dilemma! According to the law, Mary should be stoned to death! But, Joseph, "being a just man, unwilling to put her to shame', resolves to divorce her quietly. An angel appears in Joseph's sleep to explain the source of Mary's condition and tells him to make her his wife. Later, Mary, herself, seems to confer full parental rights on Joseph when she said, after a long search for Jesus, 'Your father and I have sought you sorrowing', which is described in the 5th Joyful Mystery, "The Finding of the Child Jesus in the Temple." When the census was ordered, Joseph took Mary with him to Bethlehem. He prepared a manger for the Birth & saw the Infant placed in His crib for shepherds to offer worship. He was with Mary when the infant Jesus was presented in the Temple. When the angel warned Joseph of impending danger, Joseph took her & the Child into Egypt to flee King Herod. When the danger subsided, Joseph returned them to Nazareth & raised his son in what is called the "hidden years'. Joseph & Mary took Jesus to Jerusalem at Passover when Jesus was twelve. Jesus slipped from them and, in sorrow, they found Him debating with the teachers there. Jesus returned home with them & was 'obedient to them'. Scripture says. After this, Scripture no longer mentions St. Joseph, but tradition tells us that when his time came, Joseph was rocked in Jesus' arms as he died. This is why St. Joseph is known as the Patron of a Happy Death. Jesus began His ministry about this time, 30 A.D. After the Blessed Mother, no holier person ever lived. The Bible pays him the highest compliment: "St. Joseph was a just man", meaning he opened himself totally to what God wanted him to do. He was completely obedient to God.

The name of St. Joseph's mother is not given in the New Testament, but His Father is mentioned in Matthew 1:16. He is called Jacob. Joseph was a righteous man & there's nothing greater one could say about anyone. Bishop Carl A. Kemme made a statement in 2020: "I pray for all of our men to use St. Joseph as a shining example of the kind of man that we are called to be." It is no wonder that after Our Lady, the church says "Go to Joseph".
